## Fostering Information & Application (May 2, 2021)

A piece of identification is required with current address.

Must be 19 years of age or older.

Fosters must have their own animals fully vaccinated and be able to prove such, on applying to foster.

Fosters will be expected to administer any medications required, as directed by the RC SPCA.

The foster agrees to keep the animal in his/her care until adopted <u>(unless otherwise agreed for in the case of a dog only)</u>, bringing the animal to meet potential adopters as required, until adopted.

**Note:** Cats which leave the shelter and go out to 'foster', are not permitted back into the shelter, due to the risk of stress-related illnesses. Cats must be kept with the foster until adopted.

Fosters must be prepared to accept full liability for any incidents involving the animal, while it is away from the shelter. As with all shelter animals, we have limited knowledge of this animal. Based on our observations, as well as limited resources & expertise required to modify behavior effectively in a shelter, we believe this animal will do better in a foster home, so that this animal may become a better candidate for adoption. As such, this animal is leaving the care and control of the shelter and is going to the care & control of a foster, until adopted.

The foster now accepts all liability which may result from the fostering of this animal.

Fosters should NOT promote or post foster animals via their own social media.

## **Guidelines for Fostering Animals of the Restigouche SPCA:**

#### Revised May 2, 2021

Fostering can be invaluable as it provides the opportunity to socialize an animal, get it out of the shelter environment and give it a chance if the animal just can't adapt to the confines and the solitude of the shelter.

#### **Expectations for Fosters:**

Fosters must complete an 'Application to Foster', including references, and be 'approved'.

Fosters must have their own animals fully vaccinated and be able to proof such.

Fosters will be expected to administer any medications required, as directed by the RC SCPA.

Fosters must be prepared to accept full liability for any incidents involving the animal, while it is away from the shelter. As with all shelter animals, we have limited knowledge of this animal. Based on our observations as well as limited resources & expertise required to modify behavior effectively in a shelter, we believe this animal will do better in a foster home, so that this animal may become a better candidate for adoption. As such, the animal is leaving the care and control of the shelter and is going to the care & control of a foster. The foster now accepts all liability which may result from fostering of this animal. Fosters should NOT promote or post foster animals via their own social media. We often have situations where an animal's whereabouts, condition, etc. needs to be kept in confidence and we always want to keep the identity of fosters confidential.

## **Guidelines when fostering:**

### **Guidelines for fostering Dogs/Puppies:**

Once settled, it is preferred that a foster dog remain with a foster family until adopted. The change of living quarters and the sense of 'abandonment' once again, can be stressful for a dog when they go into a foster's home, only to be brought back to "live" in the shelter. Dogs can certainly be brought to the shelter during 'adoption hours' so he/she can be seen by visitors and potential adopters. Bringing fostered dogs back & forth is the responsibility of the foster. It should be made clear that there is an added demand on the foster to transport the animal back to the shelter to 'meet' potential adopters when necessary.

Dogs would need to be brought to the shelter to meet potential adopters once the adopter has been APPROVED.

# Guidelines for fostering Cats/Kittens:

Once a kitten or cat is fostered, it must be adopted from the foster home and can not be returned to the general population for fear of stress-related immunosuppression viruses.

Cats would need to be brought to the shelter to meet potential adopters once the adopter has been APPROVED.

To be absolutely clear, cats or kittens, taken into foster care from either the quarantine or adoption area, can NOT be returned to the Shelter for adoption and must be adopted from the Foster's home.
